#### Pastor's Pen:

As much as we'd prefer otherwise, COVID-19 has pulled up a chair and plans to stay a while. It feels like forever since things were "normal". We now find ourselves in an in between time. We humans do better with absolutes. However, sometimes God calls us to an in-between time, also called an interim time. Often these times are also "thin spaces" when God feels so close. In these interim times we are called to reflect on where we've been and where we're going.

Mark's gospel (5:21-43) tells the story of the healing of Jairus' daughter. Jairus is a leader of the temple and begs Jesus for healing on behalf of his child. Before healing the young girl, Jesus sends the crowd away and hand picks the community that will help and accompany her. He says "Talitha Kum," which translated means "Little Girl, Arise!" And she wakes upfully alive! I can imagine how uncomfortable her family must have been in that time in between hope and despair. I found new comfort in this gospel story when I discovered that Talitha is a term of endearment, like sweetie or precious one. To know that Jesus regarded her as precious adds a dimension to the story that was previously missing. "Precious one, get up!" Then, surrounded by a community of God's choice, she is restored and made whole. It was this God anointed community that fed and nourished her spirit.

During this holy and appointed interim time, we will feed and nourish one another, all the while discovering where God is calling us in the future. I pray that our normal becomes even better. I thank God for each of you and for the privilege of walking with you.

### **Ministry Exploration Team (MET)**

The MET has been meeting regularly, and Pastor Robyn has begun the process of helping us to determine what qualities our congregation most appreciates in a permanent pastor. A sampling of Calvary's members and regular attendees will be interviewed to help answer questions like: Who are we now? What do we treasure about Calvary? What opportunities is God providing us with our neighbors? (God's call into mission) and what are the characteristics a pastor would need to have to help us work in this direction?

## **Council Highlights**

Council met on Calvary's patio on July 9 with face masks and distancing. The Treasurer reports that the current balance in the General Fund is \$17,746. Income is at 53% of budget, and expenses are at 51% of budget. This month we will begin paying our interim pastor (plus the parsonage utilities which were already being paid). These expenses were not included in the 2020 budget.

Office floors were cleaned and they look beautiful, like new! The cost was \$700, paid from the General Fund Maintenance account. Remaining balance in that account is \$800.

Fire extinguishers were serviced last month, and two additional fire extinguishers are required. Waiting for an estimate on the cost.

The Council voted against an in-person coffee gathering, feeling that it is too soon and not safe to resume this type of activity. Bible Study will also continue to be on-line as opposed to in person.

Outside groups have contacted the treasurer asking if they can resume using our building for their meetings. Council voted to allow them to use the patio, bring their own chairs, agree to not use the restrooms and understand that we may have to rescind this offer if the virus worsens and we are forced to shelter again.

Staff members are still calling and checking in on families, and in some communities they are able to visit children while obeying social distancing guidelines. Because of the generous support of sponsors and donors, they have been able to distribute 73,322 food packs and 100,476 hygiene kits to children and their families!


