PASTOR'S PEN - GRATITUDE AS A DISPOSITION

I can barely wrap my head around the reality that my retirement from pastoral ministry is weeks away. I'm enjoying reviewing the past twenty years. I've met so many amazing people who've taught me

The word gratitude gets thrown around a lot. Ever since Oprah Winfrey suggested we all keep gratitude journals; the world has kept track of the things they've received or avoided. Biblical gratitude is a little different. The word for "gratitude" in Greek is χάριτι (chariti), translates as



"extending favor towards" and means giving grace, favor, gratitude, or kindness. The more common English definition is often focused on personal benefits received. In the bible gratitude is about the character disposition of being thankful for God's graces, along with the readiness to return kindness and grace.

I won't forget Katie B's contagious smile, Ina's musical gifts and sense of humor, Brenda's devotion to family, Janelle's courage, Janet's resilience, Valerie's heart and, and, and. The list goes on. This month we celebrate Thanksgiving. Let us continue to cultivate thankful hearts. Thank YOU for being you.

The Ministry Site Profile was approved by the Council at the October 14th council meeting! Interview questions for the



first round of interviews have been selected. The next step is to do a "practice" interview so the questions can be fine-tuned if needed. Pastor Amy Beverage of Templeton has graciously offered to be our guinea pig! Stay tuned!

Speaking of Compassion...We have learned that Compassion International has many more children signed up who have not yet been assigned a sponsor. They are asking for donations of \$25 to give to these un-sponsored children. Council has requested a Thrivent Grant of \$250 so that we may give 10 children a Christmas gift. Any families who wish to make a financial contribution to Compassion International on behalf of a child in need are welcomed to do so. Council Highlights

The Council voted to approve the MSP with one abstention (Pastor Robyn abstained, which is typical for an interim). The Finance Committee agreed that the maximum amount that Calvary could afford to pay a new pastor would be between \$1,500 to \$2,000/month salary plus the parsonage which was valued at

\$50,000/year (rent & utilities). Gary Brochtrup researched the tax implications if we rented out the parsonage. Calvary will able to retain the tax exempt status for both property taxes and income tax purposes.



- Advent begins on November 29. This Advent we will be welcoming the Christ child while also imagining our hearts and lives as an INN that houses the holy. How can we carry the love of Jesus into our lives and neighborhoods?
- Pastor Robyn will provide training after worship on November 14th for those interested in taking Communion to those who are homebound.
- The Building Use Policy has been revised but needs more work. There is a group that is interested in using our building for a 6-month seminar. The Executive Council members will work on finalizing the policy.
- There are three Council members whose terms are ending this year, but all three are eligible for another term. Those three members will consider if they are able to commit to another term. There are also two vacancies which will be filled if possible.
- The yard sale was a huge success bringing in \$2,586.04. The Council voted to spend \$250 on ELCA Good
 Gifts, asking our own youth to decide which gifts to choose. The remaining funds will go into the General
 Fund. Left over clothing and other useful items that are in good shape will be donated to Hospice Thrift
 Store and Iglesia.

Treasurer's Report as of September 30, 2021



Orange Praline Yams

- 1. Boil 4 pounds fresh yams until fork tender. Drain, then let cool, then peel & slice them. Place the yams in a large bowl and add the following:
 - ²/₃ cup Orange juice- freshly squeezed is best, 1 Tbsp. orange zest, 2 tsp. Salt and pepper to taste, 1 tsp. Ground ginger, ½ stick melted butter, ⅓ cup light brown sugar, 1 egg
- 2. Use a hand mixer mix all ingredients until smooth
- 3. Place into a greased (I use Pam) casserole dish
- 4. For topping, mix together: ½ cup light brown sugar, 1 stick melted Butter, 1 cup chopped pecans, 1 tsp. ground cinnamon- spread over top of yams
- 5. Cover with foil and refrigerate until ready to bake. *Can be made a day ahead*. Bake at 350 degrees for 45-50 min. Until golden brown and bubbly. (Leave foil on for about the first half of cooking time.)
