Welcome Pastor Brian Stein-Webber!

Pastor Brian Stein-Webber is a native Californian, growing up in South Pasadena. He is a life-long church person and was nurtured at Messiah Lutheran Church in Pasadena. He met Mary, who would become his spouse, at California Lutheran College. After graduation, they taught English Conversation at schools in Kumamoto, Japan with the LCA.

Upon returning to the States, they taught in parochial schools for a year and then they both entered Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley. Their first call as associate pastors was to Mount of Olives Lutheran Church in Phoenix, Arizona. Second, they both served at Christ Lutheran Church in Long Beach, California. Their two children, Philip and Juliana, were born during the Long Beach years.



Brian was called to serve in Admissions, Annual Fund and Alum Relations at Pacific Seminary in 1995. Mary had been studying for a counseling degree at Fuller Seminary, so when they moved to the Bay area, she doubled as a pastor at Trinity Lutheran Church in Oakland while starting her counseling practice. Brian enjoyed working with the students and constituents at PLTS.

In 2000, Brian was called to serve as Executive Director of the Interfaith Council of Contra Costa County, a group of 85 congregations of all faiths who worked together for mutual understanding, chaplaincy services, social ministries and a coherent voice in the public square. A year later, he coupled that work with taking over for Mary at the church in Oakland as pastor there, as Mary transitioned to full-time counseling.

In 2012, Brian was called back to PLTS as Director of Seminary Relations, where he remained until earlier this year. He helped facilitate the merger of the seminary with California Lutheran University as well as became Interim Chief Administrative Officer for a time, helping the seminary to move its campus to the downtown Berkeley area.

The Stein-Webbers vacationed in Cayucos since moving to the Bay Area in 1995, and determined that they would retire there. That move came in 2019, while they both were working. They now live in Los Osos. Brian officially retired in March of this year, and Mary is due to retire in a month.

Both of them have become familiar with Calvary Lutheran Church during these past years. Since Pastor Robyn announced her own retirement from a splendid year and a half at Calvary, Brian was contacted by synod staff to consider filling in as Long-Term Supply Pastor, and he has happily agreed to do so.

Pastor Brian loves worship and music, and will be happy to accompany this congregation as you move into the next phase of your life together in the gospel.

This year our Advent theme is "The Inn: Housing the Holy." We'll be asking God to make our heart a manger, a house for the Holy, A warm and sturdy place where hope, joy, peace and love can grow.

As we wait for Christmas and for the ultimate reign of God's return, we are called to live as if it were already here. We are called, as Walter Brueggeman said "to be a community rooted in energizing memories and summoned by radical hopes."

I pray that we all enjoy the journey, the wonder and the hope of this most blessed season. And I thank God for each one of you, grateful for the blessing of walking with you these last eighteen months. You are so blessed to have Pastor Stein-Webber join you in this ministry. I eagerly await news of where God is leading you.

Council Highlights

Stewardship response to date: 18 pledge cards have been received. Total pledged is \$50,040.00 for 2022. (General Fund = \$23,600; Local Use Only = \$26,440.00) Amount pledged for the 2021 budget was \$42,500.00.

Rev. Russ Gordon was appointed by the synod to serve as our bridge interim. Rev. Gordon was the long-time pastor of Mount Carmel in SLO

before retiring. However, Rev. Gordon's plans may have changed, and Synod is still working out the details of who will be our bridge pastor beginning the first Sunday in January.

The photo wall is in process. Jim Luke thinks he has almost all of the photos. Coffee Mondays and Fridays are available to anyone who wants to join in.

Training for those who would like to deliver Communion to those who are homebound will be put off until the Bridge Pastor is here.

ADVENT begins on Nov. 28. This year Advent will have the theme of "THE INN: Making Room for the Holy". Christmas Eve Service: "The Inn." 5:30 PM.

There is a new Building Use Policy to provide guidance and cost information to those who would like to use our buildings.

Treasurer's Report as of October, 2021

Income - \$9,092.45; Expenses - \$4,205.36. Income at the end of October is at 109.8% of our 2021 Budget for the first 10 months of 2021. Expenses are at 88.6% of the 2021 Budget for the same period.

Net income from Calvary's yard sale totaled \$3,016.45.
