
Waiver forms will be available at the door. It's going to be a reunion! Please come if you're ready.

APRIL 11 – PASTOR ROBYN TO PREACH AT HOLY HUMOR SUNDAY



A joint worship celebration will be held for all the ELCA churches of the central coast on <u>Sunday, April 11, 2021 at</u> <u>Gloria Dei Lutheran in Santa Maria.</u> For centuries, in Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant countries, "Bright Sunday" (the Sunday after Easter) was observed by the faithful as a 'day of joy and laughter' with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. The custom of the celebrations was rooted in the musings of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of

Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. The early theologians called it "Risus Paschalis" ~ the Easter Laugh. Due to the ongoing pandemic, the service will be held outdoors on the back patio at 10:00 a.m. **This service will be Calvary's service for April 11.** No other service will take place. Those who want to attend in person are asked to mask up and wear warm clothing. Those who feel uncomfortable doing so can watch the service online. A short business meeting will be held following the service to elect Laura Krueger as our Conference Representative to the Synod Council. 


Call Process Update

This month we completed the MET (Ministry Exploration Team) process by writing a narrative summary of our interviews and survey responses along with a snapshot of area demographics. This summary has been approved by the synod, clearing us to move forward with the call process. Thank you to everyone on the MET team. You served well.

Council has decided to move slowly through these next steps in order to allow the membership and finances to stablelize, while continuing conversations with our members. The official next steps include forming a call committee and developing our "ministry site profile" or MSP. The synod will use our finished MSP to match us to available candidates.

Pastor Robyn has been retained for a second year, moving from full to part time while she guides us through the process of creating the MSP, interviewing candidates and ultimately calling a pastor.

If you've not visited our Little Library/Food Pantry lately, the neighbors have largely taken over. One day it's nearly empty and the next day it gets replenished!
