Pastor's Pen: May, the Gateway to Summer Renewal

I will refresh the weary and satisfy the faint. - Jeremiah 31:25



May is here—the official gateway to summer! Growing up in Napa, we could count on the weather turning from warm to hot in May. I have fond memories of eating lunch under shade trees, stealing eggs to cook on the sidewalk and standing in front of the portable water cooler in our home until somebody yelled for me to move. And every year I looked forward to vacation. Oh where would we go? This year it seems

we're talking more about how to vacation safely. Despite our recent quarantines, staying home for months on end didn't feel restful. It felt stressful. This year we need renewal and refreshment.

I find the deepest rest when I can wander mentally, emotionally, spiritually and physically. Last night I flew home from a week's vacation in far northern Ohio. I stayed in a tiny farming town, surrounded by horses, cows, tractors and men in overalls. My fiancé's family owns a huge campground and RV park and it was opening weekend of the 57th season. It was divine. No alarm clocks,

meetings, and no place I *had* to be. I seldom really slow down even though we live where others come to do just that. The pace was unfamiliar and more needed than I realized!

Just how we find renewal and refreshment is very personal. Our Father has built Sabbath rest into our every week. Rest is tantamount to health and yet I know I've confused rest with filling every moment with activity, as long as the activity was different from the other six days. How will you find the rest and renewal you require this summer? What forms will it take?

In a way, vacations are like interims. They are in-between times. Even Calvary is resting to find best ways forward for renewal. I hope you are listening closely to who you are, what you need and how best to call a pastor with the skills and temperament to walk with you on that journey.

In my experience these kinds of personal and communal renewals have led to unique future ministries. I know of congregations that made community out of gathering musicians, poets and writers. I know of congregations that provide community space for youth activities and special schools. I've seen others who work exclusively with neighbors who live with poverty or who house small nonprofit organizations who serve the homeless. When a community of people land together on a need that refreshes their own spirits, they will gather more people who are likewise refreshed by the same things. When that happens organically, the sky is the limit. Going to church is only the first part. BEING the church is what comes next. I pray we all get some much needed vacation time to re-boot, connecting with whatever makes you feel most alive. What would make Calvary become most alive? Those are some of the questions we'll answer this year in the call process.

Council met on Thursday, April 8.

The Treasurer presented an estimate of \$1,000 to have the trees trimmed. Council approved having the trees trimmed using funds in Designated Funds #3221-Property Needs.

GENERAL FUND: The current balance in the Chase General

checking account is \$20,296.75 as of April 8, 2021. Actual Income for March, 2021 was \$5,370.00; Actual Expenses were \$5,994.01. Net income of (\$624.01).

Council agreed that in-person worship will continue with masks and social distancing as long as it is safe and allowed to do so.

Normally the new Council members are installed during a service in January. This did not happen this year because of Covid-19. Pastor Robyn would like to install the Council members now that we can meet in person. Council members will be installed on Sunday, May 2.

Joyce B. and Gail B. attended a Zoom Synod Leadership Conference. Discussions included Empowering every member of the Council, succession planning, code of conduct, and recognizing other leaders and inviting them to participate. Gail B. sent a summary of the conference to Council members. Our Mission Statement will be worked on by the Call Committee.

Some of the Executive Council met with Ina Davenport, the Music leader and agreed on the terms of an updated contract.

The Outreach Committee meeting spent their April meeting time assembling goodie bags for Easter. Members provided candy, butterflies and Alleluias to fill the bags. The Community Dinners in Morro Bay and Los Osos are going well, and we're always looking for more cooks and helpers. The next dinner will be in

Update: It's time for us to form a Transition/Call Team

The Transition Team or "Call Committee" is a key component of the Intentional Interim Ministry process. In fact, it is the single most important element. The Team is

- 1. A group of trusted individuals selected by the congregation to guide the process.
- 2. A group of spiritually wise leaders; individuals that members would go to (other than clergy) if they had deep questions of faith.
- 3. Representative of the entire congregation (a microcosm).
- 4. A critical strategy in the process because it communicates that this is the congregation's work.
- 5. A model to the congregation in looking for God's movement among the people as they seek to discover God's will, purpose and direction for the future of the congregation.
- 6. The Intentional Interim Minister's accountability group.
- 7. The group who determines when the congregation is ready to draft and submit the Ministry Site Profile to the Synod. It is this group that will interview potential pastors the Synod refers for interviews.
- 8. A new group with a new life. This last point is particularly important. It would be much quicker and easier to simply take an existing group such as the Council or MET team and ask them to serve as the Transition Team, however the Transition Team has several objectives that help the Team accomplish their work. They will:
 - a. Become a safe, trusting and open group where members can share their disappointments and concerns .
 - b. Customize the Intentional Interim Ministry process and activities to fit their particular congregation's needs.
 - c. Lead the interim process while other leaders continue the ongoing leadership functions of "running" the faith community.
 - d. Are ultimately responsible to recommend to the council and then the congregation the selection of the final pastoral candidate.
 - e. Become a safeguard in two respects:
 - $\circ~$ the Team facilitates the congregation's engagement of the transition work rather than the interim minister doing the work for the congregation.
 - the Team prevents the interim minister from being perceived as extending the transition time for their own personal benefit.

The Interim Minister will direct the process and attend all of the early meetings of the group. Later she will be available as needed but not attend every meeting. It also is crucial that the whole congregation has an opportunity for input and that the entire process is explained before receiving any suggestions about who should serve on the Team. Qualities apparent in a person who will serve on the Transition Team include being... *trusted, respected, prayerful, spiritually wise, a regular attender, a regular contributor, able to speak for groups within the congregation – not representatives, but representative, willing to listen to all perspectives.* Council will talk more about identifying this team at their next meeting. Stay tuned. Stay prayerful. Are you sensing a call to serve?
