Pastor's Pen: God is Good (no asterisk)




If you attended our worship service on July 25, this may sound familiar. Truth is, I wrote this article first, before it also became part of a sermon.

While I was in Minneapolis for vacation and a wedding, I had the blessing of reconnecting with a pastor friend of mine. He and I served churches in the same neighborhood. That visit got me thinking about **resource poverty**. Are you familiar with that term? Essentially it refers to our state of mind when we're certain we don't have the resources to take care of our needs. Sometimes based in fear, resource poverty can affect us as individuals or as

congregations. And it's not uncommon for church finances, for example, to become intertwined with anxiety. When it comes to church finances, I support caution and due diligence- as long as it doesn't limit God in the process. Please read on.

Visiting Pastor Jeff, I recalled that for the last decade he's been strategizing and innovating in order to keep his church open. Gethsemane Lutheran sits in a neighborhood unfairly burdened with crime, misunderstanding and true poverty. One year their boiler died in the middle of winter. Another year their preschool broke their lease, pulled out and left a huge budget deficit. And this year I learned that the church's barbecue/smoker had been stolen. But true to Pastor Jeff's we-won't-take-no-for-an-answer heart, each time he experienced a setback, he would summon the media, who



would publicize the situation, giving people the opportunity to come together and help.

Well, it turns out that years of community engagement has resulted in boatloads of donations and volunteers, so much so that they just built a 2,000 square foot building on the property to house their now huge food pantry. **Resource poverty has become abundance**. Gethsemane continue to feed the neighborhood six days a week and grow as a church. But it was what Pastor Jeff told me next that reminded me what we shouldn't have to be reminded of. (Drum roll please) **Resources are never the problem. Limiting God is the problem.** I invite us to remember that when we need the impossible done, call God. When God needs the impossible done, God will accomplish it in, with and through us.

Siblings in Christ, Calvary is ready to enter the call process. The team's first meeting is August 1, when Bishopelect Brenda Bos will be joining us. Your new pastor is being prepared as we speak. The Holy Spirit will do that work. Our job is to join God in that process.

On July 25th we joyfully affirmed receiving **Jim** and Linda Luke in membership here at Calvary. Jim and Linda have been long time members of Christ Lutheran Church in Visalia. Here is a little about them. Please introduce

yourself if you haven't already. They are a delight.

Linda is of Italian heritage and was born in San Francisco and lived there and in the Bay area until 1977. Jim is of mixed heritage (European and American Indian) and was born in San Mateo and lived in the Bay area until 1977, except for a brief time at the age of 3 when his family lived in Hartford

Connecticut. Linda is the oldest of 5 children and Jim is the older of 2 children. In December 1970 they met at the wedding rehearsal of mutual friends. At the wedding, Linda caught the bouquet and Jim caught the garter. Less than 2 months later they became engaged (Valentine's Day 1971) and were married on May 15, 1971. They just celebrated their 50th anniversary. They moved to Visalia in 1977 and lived there until this past June when they formally moved to Morro Bay.

Linda worked in retail and then as eligibility worker trainer as well as going to law school, graduated from law school and started practicing law in 1976. She practiced law for more than 40 years, retiring in 2016. Jim worked as a research chemist and then as the CFO of two separate corporations for almost 30



years before teaching high school chemistry, physics and math for 19 years and earning his doctorate in education. He retired in 2017.

In 1985 they adopted their first child, a 7-year-old named Sunshine. Sunshine now has 6 children, lives in Tulare and works as an LVN. In 1987, Linda was asked if she wanted "another Sunshine in their lives." They said yes and she came to live with them at almost 8 years old. She lives in Visalia with her long-time companion and works as a waitress.

Linda was raised Catholic, and Jim was raised Episcopalian. When they moved to Visalia, they tried a couple of churches and ended up at Christ Lutheran—where they remained highly involved members until June of this year. They are very happy to join Calvary Lutheran and look forward to being involved in church activities and continuing to help others.



We have a Call Committee. They are Jim Luke, Janet Lorenzo, Kathie Sperow, Katie Edson, Nancy Koppl and Nikki Rocha. They will begin meeting monthly in August.
