
### Rally Sunday Set for September 12<sup>th --</sup> It's not just for kids!

#### Pastor's Pen: Luther's Rose, Welcome, and Statements of Faith

If you've not yet been back inside Calvary, here is our incredible new window. This art piece is the first thing that greets members and visitors as they enter the front door. Designed and executed by local artist Ken Foran, son-in-law of Calvary member Dick Williams, the window depicts Luther's Rose. Luther's rose is considered the single image that best represents the theology of Martin Luther and the Reformation. It's a visual representation of Luther's statement of faith. What would yours be? How would you describe your beliefs? In a 1530 letter to Lazarus Spengler, who helped design the seal, Luther writes:

"First, there is a black cross in a heart that remains its natural color. This is to remind me that it is faith in the Crucified One that saves us. Anyone who believes from the heart will be justified (Romans 10:10). It is a black cross, which mortifies and causes pain, but it leaves the heart its natural color. It doesn't destroy nature, that is to say, it does not kill us but keeps us alive, for the just shall live by faith in the Crucified One (Romans 1:17). The hearts should stand in the middle of a white rose. This is to show that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace — it puts the believer into a white, joyous rose. Faith does not give peace and joy like the world gives (John 14:27). This is why the rose must be white, not red. White is the color of the spirits and angels. This rose should stand in a skyblue field, symbolizing that a joyful spirit and faith is a beginning of heavenly, future joy, which begins now, but



is grasped in hope, not yet fully revealed. Around the field of blue is a golden ring to symbolize the blessedness is exquisite, beyond all joy and better than any possessions, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal."

As part of our window's unique design, Foran added twelve faceted red stones to represent the twelve disciples, along with the three crosses (in purple) for Jesus and the two others who were convicted with him.

It's such an interesting exercise to put our faith into words and pictures. What would be at the center? What values or beliefs would surround it? I met a teacher this week who had exited a religious cult. She continues to re-establish her own identity outside of their influence. For her, Integrity would be in the center, surrounded by honesty, hope, joy, kindness and teaching. That has had me thinking. I consider myself a liberation theologian meaning that I tend to interpret the gospel through the eyes and experience of the poor and oppressed. In other words a faith of lived action designed to alleviate oppression. I suppose if I had an art piece it might include someone breaking free of chains, maybe with a sun rise background and floral buds of new birth. How about you? I'd love to hear your ideas.

### **MEET "MIKE," ONE OF OUR NEIGHBORS**

This is Mike, one of our special neighbors who keeps our food pantry stocked whenever he can. Mike shared with Pastor Robyn that he had been homeless at one time and was helped by food pantries like the one we maintain on the corner of Anchor and Monterey. Because of his gratitude, Mike now pays it forward by bringing a small bag of non-perishable food items to share with others. He knows exactly what to shop for, explaining that cans with pop top lids are easier for those on the streets than cans that require can openers. He always brings water bottles and plastic cutlery and napkin bags so that people can enjoy their meal with dignity. He was so



happy to see that Calvary had expanded our little library, that he stops by every few days to keep it full. Mike is just one of several neighbors who help.

### Council fightights

- The Call Committee has been meeting regularly.
- The return to wearing masks during the service is necessary

due to increases locally in the cases of Covid. Communion will still be provided at the rail with the notouch method we have been using.

- A sample Building Use Policy was reviewed by the group. The policy gives guidance for other groups using our building, including weddings and funerals.
- Personal note: Due to a recent diagnosis and chronic pain, Pastor Robyn will be retiring by the end of the year. The Call Committee is expected to be close to being able to select a new pastor by that time. If not, a bridge pastor will be provided by Synod.
- There are several maintenance needs on the inside and outside of the building. Gary Orback and Janet Lorenzo have created lists of things that need attention, and Ken Brocks has been busy doing painting touch up and other minor repairs outside.
- September 12 will be the Rally Day this year. A cake will be ordered to celebrate our new members, and the new stained-glass window will be dedicated along with, blessing any student or educator backpacks.
- Items are now being transferred from storage to the Fellowship Hall for sorting and pricing. Large items and furniture will be sold from the Parsonage driveway. Yard sale will be held on October 1st and 2nd
