Dear wonderful folks of Calvary,

Today I was searching around the cupboards of the auxiliary building, I think, for possible choir music of old. Mary had told me of a few of you whom she noticed had wonderful singing voices, one creating spontaneous harmonies, such as you had developed from crooning with families or in having joined in congregation singing for forever. I couldn't find what I was looking for.

But one cache I did find was of old photo books. They depicted church anniversaries, Vacation Bible Schools, group adornings of the Easter cross, installations of pastors, building projects, the dedications of the parking lot and parsonage, virtual directories of members, scores of unlabeled potluck meals, with tables virtually stuffed into our attractive social hall.

I saw faces and names I recognized: The Tways, the Sperows, the Brochtrups, the Koppls, the Lorenzos, the Orbacks, Brenda Ouwerkerk, Sherie Barker, Valerie Donohoo and family, the Forsters, the Kolbs and more. I noticed Pastor Berg's installation, done by college friend and Bishop's Assistant Barbara Borneman, and witnessed by another classmate Pastor Carl Nielsen. And, there were lots and lots of folks I didn't recognize, who have gone on from this place in one way or another.

The impression I was left with is that church life is like a river. Was it the Ancient Greek Heraclitus who coined that image? That time itself is like a river, never repeating in exactly the same way. You step out of it and then when you step back in, it is definitely not the same place. Change, rapid or glacial, is still a constant. New challenges require new responses. When just one person enters the life of Calvary Lutheran, or just one person leaves the community, we are changed.

It's a good thing we have photographs (though more are now on computer memories than on developing paper). Otherwise we might be tempted to think that the way we are is the way we've always been, or else the way we are now will continue ad infinitum. No. From moment to moment we are greeted with new joys, new tragedies, new confoundments, need for new adaptations. And that is the way it will always be in this life.

Except, as we believe, that we are grounded by God the Creator, Jesus the Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit of Renewal. The one(s) who were, who are, and who are to come. That is our stability in the midst of the river of life. They are our unsinkable boat, or anchor, our mainsail, you name the metaphor.

The church is naturally a joyful place to be. And it will also continually disappoint us. It is a human institution, with all attendant human foibles, prides, fears, out-of-control aspirations, and the like. What a wonder, then, that Jesus loves the church and us in it. So every week, or as often as we can come together, we are reminded we are redeemed and made worthy not by our works, but by the grace of the Eternal Lover.

So let us nonetheless read old stories, peruse old images, recall great events and relive glorious moments. And think, "There we went, and go, by the grace of God."

\$ Treasurer's Report For April, 2022 \$

Income - \$12,776.00; Expenses - \$21,902.69 which includes payment for replacing the 3 heater units. Income at the end of April was at 96.94% of our 2022 budget for the 4 months ended April 30, 2022. Expenses were at 96.24% (not including \$11,465 paid for the new heaters) of the 2022 Budget for the same period.

This is Pastor Brian talking again. If you were in church on May 22nd, you heard me take off on the story of the man healed by Jesus at the Pools of Bethesda, going at some length into my understandings of faith healing. From this point on, to the extent possible, we have available someone to do healing prayer on Sunday morning. On Communion Sundays, during Communion persons may receive prayers for healing by going to the chair on the outside of the baptismal font, which has found a home in front of the pulpit. On non-communion Sundays, a person will be available in the same place after the postlude.

You may come for prayer for yourself or for someone or something else. Generally, the person praying for you will ask you about your concern, and then pray for you while laying hands on you, usually on your head or your shoulder.

I am also moved at this writing to ask for general prayers for these places and persons:

- o The families of all those in Uvalde, Texas who were killed by a lone gunman at Robb Elementary School for as yet unknown reasons, including two adults and nineteen children.
- o Julie Gerrish, recently graduated from Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, whose sister Heidi Gerrish and Heidi's friend and others who were in a head-on auto accident while coming to the graduation, in which Heidi died and others are in critical condition.
- o The family of local roofing businessman Eric Bean, whose sudden death has rocked the town of Los Osos.


